


## A special request from both the MARC Board members and Entry Express:

As all of you know, our two organizations have been working together as a team to improve the process of logging Amateur passes after the completion of each hunt test, to ensure every Amateur pass is credited correctly and the membership can be confident the entries have been rigorously vetted. This process has been ongoing for the past year and although we are close, there are still issues to resolve.

As a handler, you can help by ensuring the following:

- 1- Make sure you have updated your profile on Entry Express. If your email address has changed, it is critical that you also change it on Entry Express. Likewise, your phone number.
- 2- The data collection program uses your registered name when adding your dog's passes. So, if you have registered as James, don't sign in with the Marshal using the pet name your grandmother calls you. It will not recognize you as Skippy! It will also not recognize you as Jim. So, help out the tracking by using that registered name.
- 3- Also keep your dog's titles up to date. You worked hard to get that MH, make sure it is listed in EE so no questions arise as to the validity of your dog running the MAI, because the title will be listed for all to see. It is easy to update, but if you need help, reach out to EE, they are super!
